- 1. C- Partial amputation of the foot is not associated with any maternal infections. It is also not associated with any genetic defects in an otherwise normal newborn. Amniotic bands result from ruptures of the amniotic sac. They are sticky strands, which adhere to the fetus and cut off circulation and can lead to amputation.
- 2. B- Stricture formation in the distal small intestine and colon is a relatively common complication following NEC. In a number of infants with necrotizing enterocolitis the mucosal inflammatory process may progress to transmural necrosis that may, if it does not lead to perforation, result in fibroblast proliferation, granulation tissue, and stricture formation.
- 3. A-Infants experience insensible water loss (IWL) via pulmonary and cutaneous routes and the process is multifactorial. IWL is inversely related to gestational age and weight, and is increased with respiratory distress, fever, phototherapy, activity, and ambient temperatures greater than thermoneutral. IWL is decreased with use of a heat shield, double-walled isolettes, clothing, and high relative humidity.

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

"Credentials validate expertise and give tangible recognition of professional achievements. Patients feel more confident in the care they receive from a certified provider."

List credentials in order of importance as follows:

- Highest degree earned
- Licensure/state requirements
- National certifications
- Awards and honors
- For multiple certifications, place the most recently earned last

"Because a long list of credentials can overpower a name, individuals may choose not to list all earned credentials or honors. For those individuals, they should make sure that they display the credentials that pertain to the job they perform. Of course, if being published, include all credentials - you earned them." ("Credentials Can Get Complicated," 2017).

Once certified as a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner by National Certification Corporation (NCC), the correct designation is NNP-BC (Neonatal Nurse Practitioner-Board Certified).

The grant application period is rolling—there is no deadline for grant submission. Grants will be awarded within six weeks following submission, based on the Research committee and BOD decision.

How to Perform a Literature Review

- 1. A literature review surveys scholarly articles, books, and other sources relevant to a particular issue, area of research, or theory, providing a description, summary, and critical evaluation of each work. The purpose is to offer an overview of significant literature published on a topic.
- 2. Similar to primary research, development of the literature review requires four stages:
- Problem formulation—which topic or field is being examined?
- Literature search—finding materials relevant to the subject being explored.
- Data evaluation—determining which literature makes a significant contribution to the understanding of the topic.
- Analysis and interpretation—discussing the findings and conclusions of pertinent literature.

3. What to include

- An overview of the subject and objectives of the literature review.
- Explanation of how each work compares with others.
- Which articles make the greatest contribution to the understanding and development of the area of research?
- 4. Verify that the author is reliable
- What are the author's credentials, is the author objective, is there prejudice?
- Does the work ultimately contribute to an understanding of the subject?

5. Select a database

- List the databases you will search for topic information.
- Include comprehensive databases such as OVID and CINAHL.
- May use relevant textbooks.

6. Analyze the research

- What was the research question?
- What were the authors trying to discover?

7. Types of articles to review

- Original research: Studies reporting original research, classified as primary literature. Includes hypothesis, background study, methods, results, interpretation of findings, and discussion of possible implications.
- Review articles- three types: literature reviews, systematic reviews, and meta-analyses.
- Clinical case study: Primary research that presents details of patient cases from medical or clinical practice. Contribute significantly to existing knowledge of the field. Expected to discuss signs, symptoms, diagnosis, and treatment of a disease.
- Clinical trial: Methodology, implementation, and results of controlled studies in a patient population.
- Perspective, opinion, and commentary articles: Present a personal point of view critiquing widespread notions pertaining to a field. May review a single concept or a few related concepts. Considered as secondary literature, not a reliable source.
- 8. Include a bibliography, and cite references using APA.

SUMMER LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Florida Legislation

In an effort to combat the national opioid epidemic in Florida, in March 2018 Governor Rick Scott signed HB 21 creating new limits on schedule II prescriptions for pain medication. These restrictions do not apply to patients suffering pain from cancer, terminal illness, symptoms related an incurable, progressive illness or injury, palliative care, or serious traumatic injuries.

The law requires that a prescribing practitioner see a patient being treated with controlled substances for chronic nonmalignant pain at least once every three months.

In proposing the 2018 legislation, lawmakers focused attention on preventing addiction through placing opioid prescription limits for patients with acute pain. The law places a three-day limit on opioid prescription for acute pain. However, the practitioner may prescribe up to a 7-day supply if he or she determines it is medically necessary.

Update from the Florida Department of Health Attention All Prescribers

If you are a prescriber who is registered with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and authorized to prescribe controlled substances pursuant to 21 U.S.C. s. 822, you must complete a board-approved continuing education course on prescribing controlled substances as part of the biennial license renewal. You will be asked to provide information regarding your DEA registration at the time you apply for renewal.

Update on Florida Bills

HB 1337 – Nursing changes Advanced Practice licensure by (effective October 1st)

• Transitioning ARNP (Advanced Registered Nurse

- Practitioner) certification to APRN (Advanced Practice Registered Nurse) license;
- Converting CNS (Clinical Nurse Specialist) license to APRN license (under protocol agreement with supervising physician & eligible for DEA registration); and
- Valid licenses on 9/30/18 will convert automatically to new APRN license.

HB 21 - Controlled Substances Effective Date: July 1, 2018 Summary:

Requires practitioners to complete a specified board-approved continuing education course to prescribe controlled substances. The bill defines "acute pain" and establishes prescribing guidelines and grounds for disciplinary action if not followed. It limits opioid prescriptions for the treatment of acute pain to a specified period under certain circumstances and requires health care practitioners to check the prescription drug monitoring program (PDMP) database prior to prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance.

Additionally, the bill requires pain management clinics with an exemption from registration to register their exemption with the Department of Health with no fee, and specifies a new certificate is required if a change of address occurs.

HB 29 - Military and Veterans Affairs Effective Date: July 1, 2018

Summary:

Cited as the Don Hahnfeldt Veteran and Military Family Opportunity Act. Revises expedited licensure requirements for active duty military spouses to practice dentistry and eliminates the supervision level requirement for a temporary professional license for dentistry.

Authorizes licensing boards to recognize certain militaryissued credentials earned by active duty military members and their spouses for purposes of issuing a license in a health care profession and designates March 25th of each year as "Medal of Honor Day."

SB 510 - Reporting of Adverse Incidents in Planned Out-of-Hospital Births Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Summary:

Requires physicians, osteopathic physicians, nurse midwives, and licensed midwives who attended an attempted or completed non-hospital birth to report certain adverse incidents to the Department of Health (DOH). DOH is required to review the incident report and determine if the incident involves conduct that is subject to disciplinary action; then, if disciplinary action is necessary, DOH must refer the matter to the appropriate board, or to the department if there is no regulatory board. Requires the Department to adopt rules implementing this section and develop a form for reporting adverse incidents.

Scholarship Application 2018 Eligibility Guidelines

- 1. Applicants must be FANNP members.
 - a. All voting members, student members and associate members are eligible.
 - b. Priority for scholarship awards will be given to voting members, followed by student members and then associate members.
 - c. Priority for scholarship awards will be based on length of membership and service to FANNP.
- 2. Applicants must be a licensed RN, ARNP, NNP or equivalent.
 - a. Preference will be given to currently licensed NNPs working towards an advanced NNP degree.
- 3. Applicants must attend an educational program leading to a degree related to the health care field during the application period.
 - a. The application period for the 2018 scholarship is September 15, 2017 to September 15, 2018 (i.e. to be eligible for a 2018 scholarship you must have attended classes sometime between September 15, 2017 and September 15, 2018).
 - b. An applicant may receive a maximum of two scholarship awards for each degree sought.
- 4. Applicants will provide a short article, case study, practice pointer, evidenced-based practice update or literature review to be published in the FANNP Newsletter.


