A disruption in the well-orchestrated fetal-to-neonatal cardiopulmonary transition at birth results in the clinical conundrum of persistent pulmonary hypertension of the newborn (PPHN). Despite advances, death or ECMO occurs in 10-20% of term infants with PPHN. This talk reviews the fetal circulation, cardiopulmonary transition at birth, etiology, and pathophysiology of PPHN using specific examples such as meconium aspiration syndrome, hypothermia and congenital diaphragmatic hernia.
